

March Demo - Mike Kuterbach - End Grain Box




Keystone member Mike Kuterbach will demonstrate turning an end grain box. A box is a great project for those who have mastered "bumps on a stick". It requires a minimal number of tools - roughing gouge, spindle gouge, parting tool and a round nose scraper.

Mike will cover wood selection, design considerations, shaping the outside, hollowing the inside and fitting the lid. He will also show a quick and easy finish for small projects. Mike is a fabulous demonstrator. Even experienced turners will pick up some tricks from Mike's demo.



Help Needed – Show and Tell Photography



We need help with taking photos of members' work at our meetings. Without a volunteer doing this, we may no longer be taking photographs of our Show & Tell There will be no pictures on the website or Facebook of members' work.

This is a great opportunity for members to get an up close look at all of the great pieces we have for show and tell, before hearing the creators talk about their work.

We need 2 members to be a photo team for show and tell. It is a fun job with two persons, and also there would be backup if one is out. You would need would need to arrive by 6:15 - 6:30 to set up, and take pics.

Basically, the tasks required are to take the photo, and rename the photo with the name of the person who made the piece (Sophisticated software often takes the file name and puts it on the photo so viewers can read who made the lovely item).

This entire job can be done with a phone. Bonus, but not required - if you have the skill, crop and set white balance and level.
